

Considerations

To file for City Office, there are a few things you must consider:

- ◆ **Do you qualify?** - Carefully read the panel entitled “Qualifications.” If you still have questions, you may read the City Charter online at www.cityofjefferson.net or purchase a copy from the City Clerk for \$1.
- ◆ **Endorsement** - In 2002, the voters of Jefferson City approved a “non-partisan” election system. A filing fee is no longer required to file as a candidate for City Office. However, endorsements from three persons who reside in the area which you wish to represent must be signed either before a notary public or the City Clerk. Candidate Endorsement forms may be obtained from the City Clerk’s office or printed from the web site listed in the paragraph immediately above.
- ◆ **Terms** - The term for Mayor is four years; all other elected offices are for two-year terms (with the exception of an unexpired term). The City of Jefferson has term limits of eight years for each elected office. For more information on term limits, please refer to the City Charter.

Public Relations

After filing, most candidates provide press releases to the local news media, including their background information, position statements and reasons why they are seeking the position.

Qualifications

To qualify to seek a seat on the Council, the City Charter requires the following qualifications:

Age - Candidates must be at least 21 years old at the time of election

Citizenship - Candidates should be a United States citizen and be a qualified voter of the City of Jefferson

Residency - Candidates must have lived in the City for at least a year before the election and in the ward they wish to represent for six months prior to the election

Background - Candidates can have no outstanding debts to the City, nor can they have ever been guilty of misappropriation of funds in office or been removed from a seat on the Council

Mayoral Qualifications - The above qualifications apply to Mayoral candidates, except that the candidate must be at least 30 years old and have lived in the City two years.

Municipal Judge Qualifications - Candidate must be a licensed attorney in Missouri, a resident of Jefferson City and Missouri between the ages of 24 and 75. The Municipal Judge can hold no other City positions.

Prosecutor - Candidate must be a licensed attorney in Missouri and a City resident at the time of the election; have no outstanding debts to the City; and never been found guilty of misappropriation of funds in office.

Election Information

Filing Period - Candidates may file at City Hall between 8:00 A.M. on Tuesday, October 18, 2005, and 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday, November 22, 2005.

Offices Open - One Council seat from each of the five city wards (2 year terms);

Election Dates - Primary (if needed), Tuesday, February 7, 2006. General, Tuesday, April 4, 2006.
